The Animal-Human Violence relationship is so relevant in predicting future violence, that in 2016, the FBI started tracking animal cruelty cases in the National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS). This pattern is clearly seen in most serial and mass murder killers; with early recognition and intervention, NIBRS may stop some future violence. This course will provide students with the tools to help identify the maltreatment of children, the elderly, and animals; the need for mandated reporting; multi-agency interactions; and, theories of why people hurt animals. By recognizing the precursors to future violence, students will understand the cycle of violence and "The Link."

- Theory on battered victims and animals
- Interviewing when animals are involved
- Signs of child maltreatment
- Signs of elder abuse
- Signs of animal abuse
